At present the college imparts teaching to the undergraduate students with the subjects like English, MIL (Odia), Sanskrit, Political Science, Education and History. The total students' strength of the college is at present nearly 350. But the college lacks proper infrastructure facility to provide adequate teaching. There are only 4 nos. of class rooms and there is no separate Library and Reading Room in the college.
